Main theme:

Adaptation of spatial development to climate change impacts
by climate proof spatial planning

Main objectives:

Contributing to **sustainable, 'climate-proof' spatial development** and **preventive climate change adaptation by means of spatial planning** (preventing, avoiding, mitigating adverse impacts) by building on four main pillars:

- Developing and applying a transferable concept, methodology and procedure of **regional vulnerability assessments** to provide vulnerability maps, profiles and descriptions of model regions
- Evaluating the **"climate change fitness" of spatial planning systems**
- Conducting **stakeholder dialogue, risk communication & awareness-raising activities** in model regions and investigating the performance of existing **regional risk governance** systems
- Developing new **climate-proof spatial planning strategies** on transnational, national and regional levels.

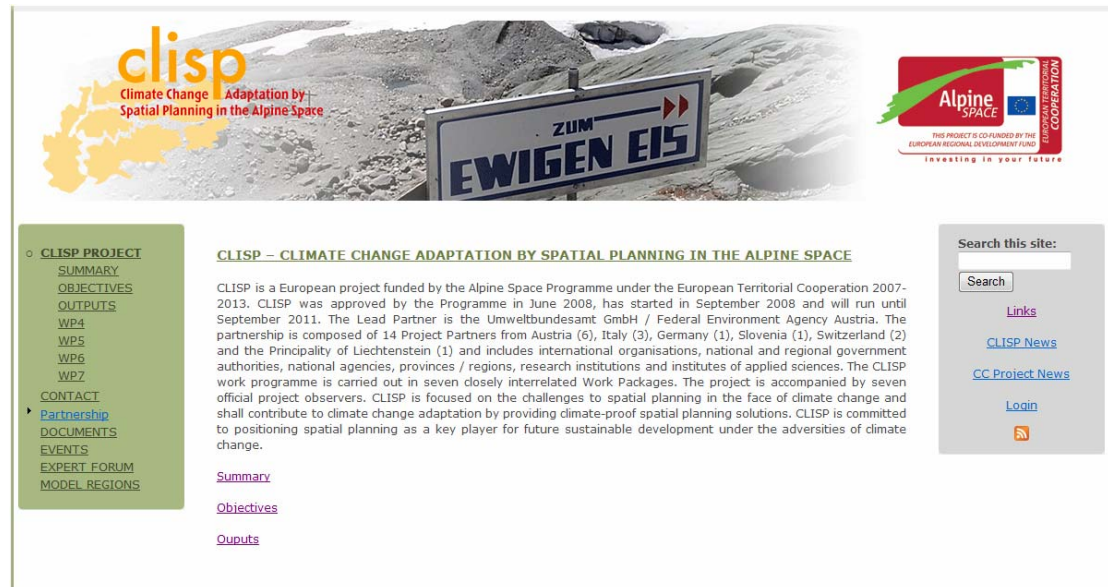

CLISP – Expected Core Outputs

WP5 – Spatial Planning Fitness:

- Operational concept **to evaluate the 'climate change fitness' of spatial planning systems** (policy & legal framework, instruments, procedures, application etc.) and guidance for planning authorities
- **In-depth knowledge** on strengths and weaknesses of **spatial planning systems** regarding their climate-proofness and adaptation capacities
- Set of enhancement options
- **Database of best practice** examples of climate-proof planning activities
- **Transferable self-evaluation** tool for Alpine regions and municipalities

CLISP – Expected Core Outputs

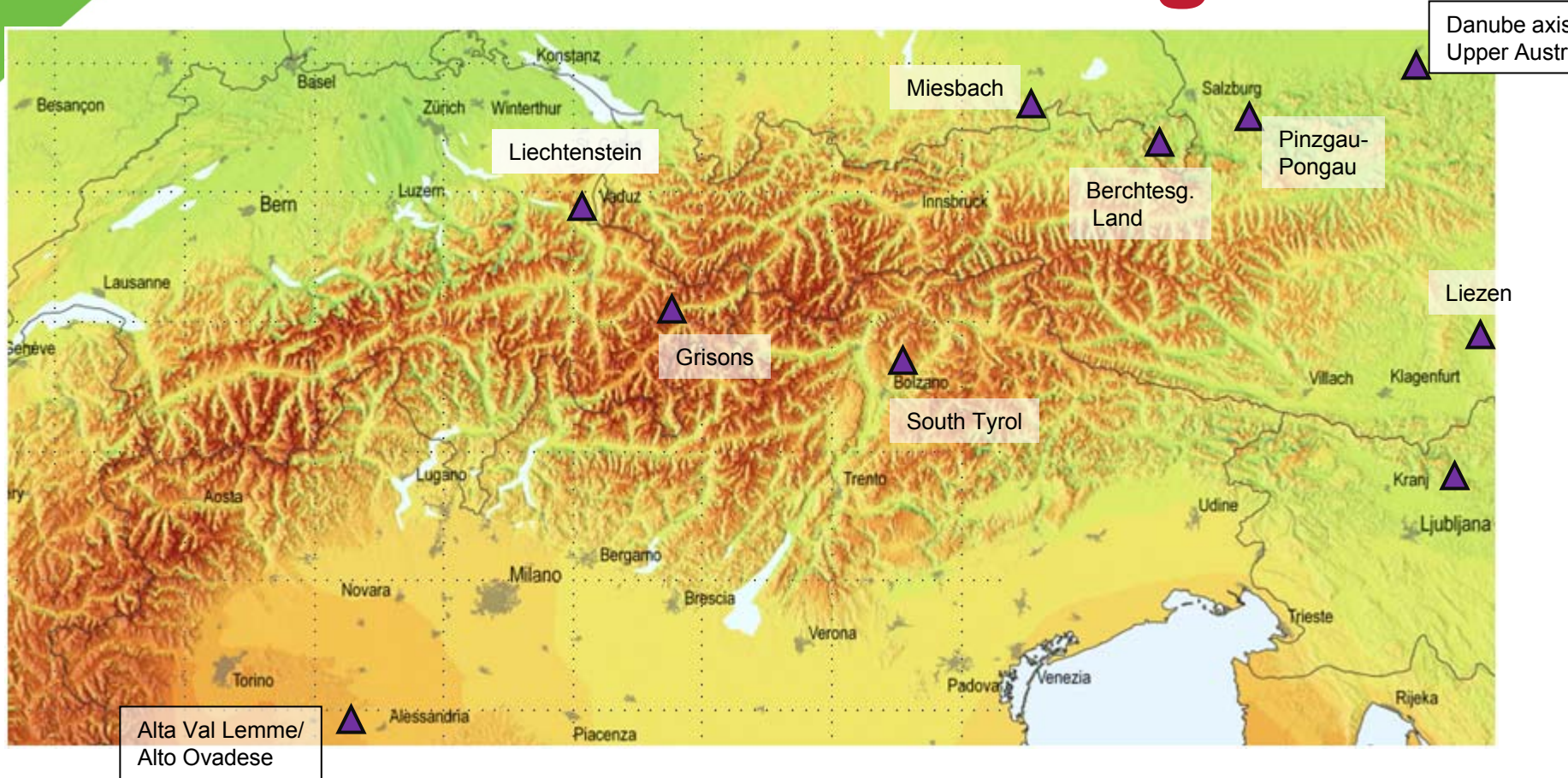
WP6 – Risk Communication & Governance:

- Integration of Stakeholder's views & consideration of differences in planning cultures
- Knowledge on strengths and weaknesses of regional risk management systems and recommendations for improving risk governance frameworks
- Climate-related risk governance principles introduced to spatial planning procedures
- Better awareness of stakeholders and decision-makers on climate-related risks

WP7 – Climate Proof Planning:

- Knowledge base, recommendations and policy options for climate-proof spatial planning strategies at transnational, national and model region level
- Active transnational expert network for information exchange and cooperation between planning authorities, expert institutions and other existing platforms
- Consideration of project results in revision of spatial development concepts
- Knowledge transfer to other regions (within & beyond the Alpine Space) & stimulation of implementation processes
