Call for Applications

"Mountains of Opportunities"

A Summer Course for Young Professionals and Students on Spatial Planning and Territorial Governance on the Fringe of Mountain Areas

organized by ARL European Working Group AlpPlan - alpine spatial planning network

Date: 01 - 04 July 2023

Location: Avignon and the surrounding area of Département Vaucluse (Région Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur, France)

Accommodation: ibis Avignon Centre Gare

Seminar venue: Novotel Avignon Centre

What is the course about?

The fringes of mountain areas are particularly relevant for spatial planning and research, as they often represent transition areas between different land use intensities. Especially in the Alpine region, they are usually located in proximity to extra-Alpine urban agglomerations and are therefore strongly influenced by them. Here, numerous challenges for sustainable territorial development are mixed, for example in the fields of settlement and transport development as well as tourism and water management. Therefore, innovative approaches are needed, which should especially include the perspective of young professionals and students, who will be the next generation of experts on sustainable territorial development.

In a new edition of this summer course, *AlpPlan*, the alpine spatial planning network, focuses on the specific situation in the South of France between *Avignon* and *Mont Ventoux* as well as the lessons it offers for future-oriented territorial governance in the entire Alpine region. Together with local experts, the course will highlight different aspects of spatial development and related governance approaches. As a transitional area at the margins of the Alpine Convention and EUSALP perimeters, this peri-alpine region represents an interesting space from the perspective of European spatial development policy.

The course encompasses presentations, workshops/ interactive working groups and especially field trips including meetings and discussions with local experts. Several focus topics will be discussed, e.g.:

- Climate change adaptation through Agroforestry
- Tourism management
- Balancing renewable energy production, biodiversity and agriculture through Agrivoltaics
- Ways to achieve the goal of net-zero land take





Who can apply for participation?

The course is targeted at young professionals from various disciplines (e.g. public spatial planning or conservation administrations; private planning offices) as well as (PhD-) students from related academic fields (e.g. spatial planning, geography, landscape ecology, landscape architecture, political science, nature conservation etc.).

Which costs will be covered?

We will provide free hotel accommodation (single bedrooms incl. breakfast), meals and transportation during the course. Participants have to pay for their own travel to Avignon as well as the return journey.
